

## 113 Years of Rotary International

Fifty eight Rotarians and friends from Fassifern Valley, Beaudesert, Boonah and Jimboomba Clubs along with Member for Scenic Rim Joh Kruase and wife Kit, Scenic Rim Mayor Greg Christenson and wife Denise, Honorary Member John Brent, Guest Speaker Mr Gerry Garard and wife Renita and Assistant District Governor Karen Thomas, attended a dinner at Black Hall, Kalbar, to celebrate the 113<sup>th</sup> Birthday of Rotary. On 23<sup>rd</sup> February 1905 the heart or 'spirit' of Rotary came from one man's vision, Paul P Harris. Paul Harris along with 3 other gathered in an office in downtown Chicago and formed the Rotary Club of Chicago so professionals with diverse backgrounds could exchange ideas, form meaningful, lifelong friendships and give back to their communities.

"I was sure that there must be many other young men who had come from farms and small villages to establish themselves in Chicago...Why not bring them together? If others were



longing for fellowship as I was, something would come of *it.*" Paul P Harris

Towards the end of Harris's presidency year in 1908 he worked to expand Rotary beyond Chicago, he persisted and by 1910 Rotary had expanded to several other U.S. cities. Today Rotary has members in over 200 countries and territories, 34,282 member clubs worldwide and has 1.22 million members.

Our guest speaker for the night Gerry Garard, a former Vietnam Veteran spoke about his vision 4 Aussie Heroes, a foundation he at first started to help Returned Servicemen and Women experiencing difficulties with readjusting to life after deployments and the struggle that PTSD was having on some of these individuals. Gerry





later realized that PTSD & Mental Health issues also had a huge effect on first responders, therefore his program is now designed to help all men and women who serve their country and community in various ways. Gerry and his dedicated board are working with council to purchase a block of land in the Scenic Rim area so they can build a center where they can offer a rehabilitation program, which includes equine and canine therapies to assist in the recovery of the issues which affect so many veterans and first responders.

As part of the fundraising for 4 Aussie Heroes, each year they run a fundraising bike ride around the beautiful Scenic Rim. The ride covers some 230km and has an overnight stay along the way.



This year's ride will be around the Kalbar and surrounding area and will be in October sometime, date to be advised. President Scott Champion challenged the cluster clubs to put together a team to participate in the ride. Gerry's message to the dinner was inspirational, and certainly a cause well worth contributing to, President Scott asked every Rotarian in the room to be upstanding for a headcount and for each Rotarian present the Fassifern Valley Rotary Club donated \$25. A cheque for \$775 was presented to

Gerry towards the foundation. After this announcement, each of the cluster club Presidents said they would match the amount RCFV donated. The dinner was a successful evening enjoyed by all who attended. We thank the Beaudesert, Boonah and Jimboomba clubs for their attendance and their kind donations towards the 4 Aussie Heroes foundation.

#### **District Conference**



#### **RCFV Business Directory**


